What we will learn:

In this class, we are going to approach and learn new musical concepts by looking at how they are used in songs throughout the world. We are then going to apply them to our own learning of how to play melodies and rhythms on the ukulele. By the end of the course, you will probably find yourself listening to music you would have never listened to before, understanding what makes different styles of music sound the way they do, and you will be able to read, write, and perform your own music.

What we will need to prepare for this class:

- Pens and/or Pencils
- Pens will be allowed on certain projects, but the pencil is going to be our standard.
- 1 Folder with Pockets/Part of a Three-Ring Binder A way to organize handouts.
- O Some loose-leaf paper inside this folder/binder would be perfect for taking notes.

How we will be graded:

Homework, quizzes, projects, and participation are all worth points which will combine to make up your final grade. Here is what each will be worth:

- Being Prepared & Participating (i.e.: Showing up on time and being active in class each day) 50 Points Weekly
- **Desert Island Playlist & Group Projects** (There will be several projects throughout the course of the marking period to make up this grade) 50-100 Points each, depending on the size of the assignment.
- The Packet (My version of a notebook check) 100 Points, but points will be deducted for replacements or not maintaining your packet.
- All of the handouts for this class will be given to you at once in this packet. This includes some pages you will have to fill out. You can store it in class where I show you, but take care of it! I don't want you to lose your work!
- **Homework** (i.e.: Turning in assignments when they are due and taking advantage of chances to make-up credit) 10-20 Points each, depending on the size of the assignment
- Quizzes 25-50 Points each, depending on the size of the assignment
 - o These include Playing Checks, which are graded with a rubric which will be provided to you.

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Rules we will follow:

This will be a fun and exciting course, but to ensure everyone has the same experience, we need to lay out some ground rules:

- Show respect to all people in the classroom
- Show respect to other people's property.
- Talk at appropriate times and use appropriate language.
- Take care of the school instruments and keep them in good condition for the next students.

- Bring all needed materials to class (and leave distractions in your locker)
- Be seated and ready to begin when the bell rings.
- Obey all school rules.
